sextus empiricus against those in the disciplines *pros mathematikous* also known by the abbreviated title *m 1 6* deals with six specialized fields of study grammar rhetoric geometry arithmetic astrology and music in sceptical fashion it questions the credentials of those who claim to have expert knowledge in these fields it is the least well known of sextus empiricus works mainly because its subject matter is not directly philosophical some of its arguments require knowledge of these fields as they existed in the ancient world which philosophers sextus main readership tend not to have but it is a good specimen of sextus usual sceptical method of inducing suspension of judgement about the topics under consideration and it contains much that is of philosophical interest this volume aims to bring this work to a wider
