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the parent's guide to eating disorders shows that effective solutions begin at home and cost little more than a healthy investment of time effort and love based on exciting new research it differs from similar books in several key ways instead of concentrating on the grim expensive hospital stays of patients with severe disorders the authors focus on the family teaching parents how to examine and understand their family's approach to food and body image issues and its effect their child's behavior parents learn to identify an eating disorder early to establish healthy attitudes toward food at a young age and to intervene in a nonthreatening nonjudgmental way the authors concentrate on teens the age group most often affected by eating disorders as well as younger children individual chapters cover boys at risk relapse training dealing with friends school and summer camp and much more the book includes an appendix and sections on further reading organizations and websites residential and hospital programs and references

the first book offering support for parents and carers of children and young people with body dysmorphic disorder bdd this guidebook explains the condition as well as the impact that it may have in education settings family life and socialisation the guide begins by explaining how and why bdd emerges before moving onto an exploration of how the mental health condition presents itself emotionally psychologically physically and behaviourally it then offers practical advice and guidance for parents and carers on talking to their child about bdd seeking professional treatment considering medication managing social media use working with schools to build a recovery team and more the parent's guide to body dysmorphic disorder is an essential guidebook for parents of children of children and young people with bdd

abstract an updated version for parents of infants and toddlers integrates new findings into the original material and addresses the questions most often asked by parents practical methods for identifying avoiding or coping with child rearing problems are suggested the importance of the emotional and educational development of a child during the first 3 years of life is stressed emphasizing the parent's contribution descriptions of developmental stages and individual variations based on 30 years of observations and research are provided some general concerns dealt with include working parents parental roles discipline early detection of developmental problems

sibling influence play and childbirth method toys are recommended for specific levels of development behavior patterns of young children are described to provide a framework to help parents create an atmosphere conducive to successful child rearing

this unique manual was developed to help parents assist their children in dealing with bullying situations the book promotes an understanding of the nature and extent of bullying the physical emotional and educational consequences to children who are targets of bullying who do the bullying or who as bystanders are directly affected by witnessing bullying and victimization

this handbook was originally intended for parents whose children attend programs which use the creative curriculum for early childhood ccec but the informaton is also useful to parents whose children attend early childhood programs using other curriculum models based on child development theories the purpose of the handbook is to explain ways parents and teachers can work together at home and at school to help children acquire the skills attitudes and habits to do well in school and throughout life the guide explains the ccec program s philosophy and goals it describes what children are learning while engaged in particular ccec program activities and what they learn from the environment the daily schedule conversations and at home in the dining room living room kitchen children s bedroom bathroom and outside concluding remarks stress that the key to providing successful learning experiences for young children is to figure out what interests the child and use those interests to engage him or her in actively exploring and learning about the environment it is emphasized that every place is a learning environment for a child regardless of where the family lives or what kind of home the family lives in
